Employee Responsibilities

The primary concern is finding people who care about the work they are doing. Whether it be shoveling mud out of a pit, pressure testing a 4,000 gallon well field circuit, or overhauling a gearbox, our employees should strive to do the best work they can while respecting the people they are working with and the equipment they are operating.

Employee Qualifications

A love of equipment is a must. We operate drill rigs, mud cleaners, back hoes, pumps, and pickup trucks. Without the equipment and tools we cannot perform work.

Passing drug tests and background checks are critical. Oilfield work is a large part of what we do and our employees must be drug-free.

There are many safety trainings that must be completed and maintained in order to be on site.

A class A CDL license will be required as we regularly pull trailers with heavy equipment. If someone is comfortable handling trailers but does not have a CDL, that may not disqualify employment.



Work Summary

Anything and everything needed to help complete the current task would be your responsibility. The best way to think of it is, there are about 1,000 little jobs that need to be completed in a particular order so we can complete the project.

The work is physically intense with literal shoveling of mud out of a pit, throwing drill steel down a slide, and handling 50lb bags of material. You will be climbing on and off equipment regularly and doing plenty of walking.

Someone needs to enjoy that type of work in order to perform. You cannot wake up everyday hating what you do.
